Course Description

Developed in 2001, the Train the Trainers (TTT) program concentrates on expanding the educational skills of educators in the fields of gastroenterology, hepatology, endoscopy, and GI surgery, who are responsible for teaching, through the use of current educational techniques and philosophies. It brings together faculty and participants from across the globe in an intensive and interactive workshop, characterized by numerous hands-on sessions with ample opportunity for discussion. TTT is dedicated to the development of teaching and training skills.

Participants are required to engage actively in all sessions and social functions; therefore they are required to attend all workshop days. In addition to fully participating in the program, we require that participants commit to the completion of the pre-workshop questionnaire, on-site evaluation, and post-workshop evaluation. Their responses assist WGO in best meeting their expectations prior to the workshop commencement and also serve as data that WGO compiles to measure the impact of the TTTs overall contribution to continuing education.

Some topics presented at this TTT Workshop will include: Adult Education, Teaching Procedural Skills, Professionalism, Conflict Management, Evidence-based Medicine (EBM), Feedback and e-Learning.

Some of the Learning Objectives Include:

- Identify the basic interpersonal skills required to build effective teams and enhance the quality of healthcare
- Utilize the concept of domains of learning in planning their teaching and assessment
- Employ set, dialogue and closure in setting up a psychomotor skills training session and use a four step method of teaching psychomotor skills
- Differentiate linear vs collaborative and synchronous vs asynchronous eLearning
- Define the terms assessment and appraisal as they relate to the evaluation of trainees
- Evaluate guidelines on how to conduct an effective clinical research through Critical Appraisal and Evidence-based Medicine
- Write effective test questions that you can use in any educational session
- Identify the relationships among training requirements, certification criteria, licensure standards and credentialing prerequisites to then understand the rationale and benefits of credentialing and design a process for credentialing and recertifying physicians for procedures

Recommended Audience

WGO Member Society and WGO Training Center Directors may nominate up to two trainees who meet the qualifications below:

- Must be **fluent** in English
- Is a Gastroenterologist, Hepatologist, Endoscopist, or GI Surgeon

- Is responsible for training other healthcare professionals and would like the opportunity to enhance their training knowledge and skills.
- **Participants are required to attend the entire workshop and should plan to arrive on the specified arrival and departure dates listed above.**
- Participant will commit to putting the TTT workshop lessons into place upon return to their own teaching environment.

Application Review

Applications will be reviewed for adherence to the above criteria and for equal geographical, gender and expertise distribution. **Priority will be given to WGO member societies that have paid their dues through 2019 and WGO Training Center Directors that have completed their 2018 WGO Annual Report.**

Applications will be reviewed in late January 2019 with notifications going out in early February 2020 to both the nominator and nominee via email.
